Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read [Colossians 3:22-4:1](#).

1. The slave-master relationship isn't common in our day. But in what other relationships or situations does the principle of *submission to authority* apply?
2. Why is submission to authority often seen as a threat?
3. What motivation for *serving sincerely* is given in [vs. 22](#)? What does it look like to live this out? See also [Psalm 34:8-10](#); [Proverbs 1:7](#); [9:10](#); [2 Corinthians 7:1](#); [Hebrews 10:31-34](#); [12:25-29](#).
4. On the one hand, Paul says we should try to *please our earthly masters all the time*. Then he says we are to *work for the Lord, rather than for people*. What is he trying to say?
5. According to this passage, what implications are there for those who are *in charge* of others? See also [1 Peter 5:1-5](#).
6. What is involved in biblical submission to authority? See also: [Romans 13:1-7](#); [1 Peter 2:21-23](#); [3:1-6](#).
7. Paul says you should *obey in everything you do*. Are there any limits to submission to authority? See also [Acts 5:29](#); [Ephesians 5:21-27](#).

8. Submission to God is saying, *Lord, I want your will more than I want my own way*. Describe a time this was *not* your attitude? What was that like? How did the situation turn out?
9. What does it mean that we will be *given an inheritance as a reward* and also *paid back for the wrong we have done* ([vs. 24-25](#))? If Christ made a *full sacrifice for our sin* ([Hebrews 9:26-28](#)), and if salvation is *not by our works* ([Ephesians 2:8-9](#)), then what is Paul teaching us in [vs. 24-25](#)?
10. If you work for someone else, what attitudes do you need to ask God to change in you?
11. In a sentence or two, summarize [Colossians 3:22-4:1](#).
12. What's your biggest takeaway from this week's teaching?
